

to gather and celebrate our chapter's contributions to our community and campus. To date, 175 brothers have pledged \$1,847,185 to the campaign.

He strived for two years to establish his interior design trade, but ultimately found his way back to service in the form of logistics management with the Air Force at Kelly Air Force Base in San Antonio. Jerry continued his Naval Reserve career until his retirement in 1985 as a commander with 32 years of service. He retired from his career in


logistics management in 1993.

ed to have a great day, leaving them to focus on the heated competition on the greens.





On an award winning note, the Oklahoma Alpha Chapter won an Excelsior Award for recruitment and we were recognized for our status as a Residential Learning Community (RLC) at Carlson Leadership Academy.
