Chet Fenimore '85 Shares Lessons from SigEp

The best advice **Chet Fenimore '85** has ever received was: "If you want to go fast, go alone. If you want to go far, go together." Those words remind him that true leadership is about empowering others, not just seeking personal achievement. "Being part of SigEp taught me the value of trusting and relying on others and recognizing that strength comes from shared responsibility and support."

Chet was introduced to SigEp by a close high school friend, **Trey Deupree '85**, and he was drawn to the brothers' values-based approach for life during and after college. Upperclassmen took the time to get to know Chet, becoming great role models for his time as pledge trainer (among other chapter offices).

Oklahoma Alpha gave Chet a foundation in leadership, accountability, and service that he has maintained ever since. "It instilled in me the importance of surrounding yourself with people who hold you to a higher standard—and also support you when you face challenges in life."

After graduating, Chet spent several years as a bank examiner and then attended law school on the advice of brothers such as **Joe Rolston '86** and **Mike Daniel '85**. He moved to Texas afterward and worked for a major national law firm, eventually founding his own firm in Austin that specializes in banking law. "Over the years, I've represented community banks across the country, helping them navigate complex regulatory environments and M&A transactions."

Living in Austin makes it difficult to visit Stillwater often, but each time he sees his fraternity brothers, they immediately pick up where they left off without missing a beat. He hopes Oklahoma Alpha continues to form friendships that last a lifetime.

"Focus on building relationships, not just a résumé," he urges today's young brothers. "The friendships and mentorships you form now—whether with your brothers, professors, or others you meet along your journey at OSU—will shape your life in ways you can't yet imagine."


Growing Our Endowment
